Hello,

I just wanted to send out an update to all those who attended our "Nanticoke Visioning" conference in late March or who voiced an interest in our project but could not attend. Over the past few months, we have been reviewing the results of the conference and all of the fantastic dialogue that occurred among our diverse stakeholder groups. We are now in the process of developing an official "watershed management plan" that integrates as much of your input as possible.

Over the next several months, we will be working with many individuals and partner organizations to create a draft watershed management plan. Throughout this process, we'll solicit feedback from you so that we can ensure we are best representing your interests. We welcome your continuing participation in this process – our goal is to have a complete Nanticoke Watershed Management Plan by May of 2011. Though it will be a "living document" (i.e. updated as current needs dictate), the management plan will serve as a concrete tool for decision makers and planners to protect the critical resources in our beautiful and treasured area.
